Victor Benassi has been a professor, department chair, and academic administrator at the University of New Hampshire (UNH). He is Faculty Director of the Center for Excellence in Teaching and Learning. He is President and a fellow of the Society for the Teaching of Psychology (American Psychological Association). He was principal investigator of a Davis Educational Foundation (DEF) grant—The Cognition Toolbox: Implementing Cognitive Principles and Assessing Student Learning in College Courses (2009-2012). He is currently principal investigator of a DEF grant: Teaching and Learning with Multimedia (2012-2015). He is co-editor (with William Buskist) of *Effective College and University Teaching: Strategies and Tactics for the New Professoriate* (2012, Sage Publications). He is the editor, along with colleagues Catherine Overson and Chris Hakala, of a forthcoming book, titled *Applying the Science of Learning in Education: Infusing Psychological Science into the Curriculum*. In 2003, he received the American Psychological Foundation's Charles L. Brewer Distinguished Teaching of Psychology award. His current research focuses teaching and learning, including the application of science of learning principles to teaching in colleges and universities.
