Dr. Christopher Cratsley is the Director of Assessment at Fitchburg State University. He served as a Professor of Biology, interim Department Chair of Biology and Chemistry and Graduate Program Chair for Biology and Science Education before taking on his current role. Dr. Cratsley received his Bachelor's degree in Biology from Brown University and completed their Undergraduate Teacher Education Program. He taught public High School

College AAC&U Quality Collaboratives Dyad to explore student learning in the context of transfer
articulation between two and four year institutions.
