

John Gabrieli



John Gabrieli is the Grover Hermann Professor of Health Sciences and Technology and Cognitive Neuroscience at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). He has a dual appointment in the Department of Brain and Cognitive Sciences and the Institute for Medical Engineering and Science (IMES). He is also a Principal Investigator of the McGovern Institute for Brain Research, a Member of the Faculty of Education of the Harvard Graduate School of Education, and an Associate Researcher in the Department of Psychiatry at Massachusetts General Hospital. He is Director of the Athinoula A. Martinos Imaging Center at the McGovern Institute for Brain Research. He received a B.A. in English from Yale (1978), a Ph.D. in Behavioral Neuroscience from the Department of Brain and Cognitive Sciences at MIT (1987), and was a postdoctoral fellow in the Psychology Department at Harvard. His area of research is human cognitive neuroscience in which he studies the brain basis of memory, language, and thought. His recent research has focused on brain development in children and adolescents, including studies of dyslexia, ADHD, and autism. He is the first or senior author of over 250 papers published in peer-reviewed scientific journals, including *Science* and *Nature*.
