Lee Cuba is professor of sociology at Wellesley College, where he has taught since 1981. His research is concerned with the acquisition and meaning of place identities, with a particular focus on how migrants come to feel at home in new places. From 2005 to 2014, Cuba served as a co-PI of the New England Consortium on Assessment and Student Learning (NECASL), a research group involving seven liberal arts colleges whose work informs *Practice for Life*. Cuba has also held a variety of administration positions at Wellesley: chair of the sociology department, associate director of the Writing Program, associate dean of the college, and dean of the college.
