Mary Anne Moran is the associate principal at Nipmuc Regional High School, where she began working in 2003 as a math educator and transitioned into the role of associate principal in 2011. She has collaborated with teachers to redefine teaching and personalize learning through the implementation of a successful 1:1 program and promoted authentic learning through the development of 21st century learning conferences. In partnership with students, parents, and community members, Mrs. Moran helped launch the Nipmuc STEM scholars program and the Humanities Scholars Program, focusing on providing students with opportunities to connect their work in the classroom to careers through career exploration, workplace readiness training, collegiate experiences, and rigorous academic programming. In acknowledgment of her work on the local and state levels, Mrs. Moran was named the Massachusetts School Administrators Association (MSSAA) 2016 Assistant Principal of the Year.

Mrs. Moran shared her professional work not only with other local high schools, but also at the Massachusetts STEM Summit, National Consortium of Secondary STEM Schools (NCSS) Conference, Massachusetts Assistant Principals Conference, MSSAA summer institute, and the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) Annual Conference.
