Mariko Silver is President of Bennington College, Bennington, VT. Earlier she was a senior advisor to the president of Arizona State University where she designed and led international and community initiatives focused on economic development, interdisciplinary science initiatives, and student success. Dr. Silver also served as Professor of Practice in ASU's School of Politics and Global Studies. She served in the Obama administration as Acting Assistant Secretary for International Affairs and Deputy Assistant Secretary for International Policy of the US Department of Homeland Security where she led the creation of the first department-wide international strategy, managed the Department's international engagements, and co-developed a global initiative to enhance aviation security. Prior to that, she served as Policy Advisor to Arizona Governor Janet Napolitano, with responsibility for the state's public and private universities, community colleges, and vocational institutions; the Arizona Department of Commerce; and Science Foundation Arizona. In the office of the Executive Vice Provost of Columbia University, Dr.

Silver co-developed a multi-institution research response to the events of 9/11 and helped establish the International Innovation Initiative. She has also worked in London, UK; Bangkok, Thailand; and at the United Nations headquarters in New York City. Dr. Silver holds a BA in History from Yale University, an MSc in Science and Technology Policy from the University of Sussex (UK), and a Ph.D. in Economic Geography from the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA).
